The Mathematics Learning Area currently employs the equivalent of 19 full-time teachers. Responsibility for the learning area is shared between the Head of Learning Area (HoLA), a second in charge and several other members of the team. Mathematics teachers at Mossbourne Community Academy (MCA) are passionate about their subject. That enthusiasm is shared with our pupils; GCSE outcomes place the department in the top 100 schools in the country, year on year, and 50% of the A-level students in the Mossbourne Sixth Form elect to study maths at A level.
